Father Tom writes :-

First Reading: Acts 15: 1-2, 22-29

We hear how Paul, Barnabas, Barsabbas, Silas, the apostles and the elders answered their call to do all things in the spirit. Embracing a spiritual

mind, these followers of Jesus placed the Divine Will of God first. They faithfully served the Lord for the common good of all. We have to strive towards a spiritual mind by seeking the Divine Will of God and then by embracing the final decision of the authority of the Church.

Second Reading: Revelation 21: 10-14, 22-23

In this reading we are able to see the unity of the people under One God, the Lamb. There are no idols. Nor are there any man-made religions whose leaders get the credit for establishing faiths that differ from the sacred teachings of Jesus. We hear of the people's quality of holiness because they all belonged to the city of Jerusalem which is a holy city.

Gospel: John 14: 23-29

John tells us to have eternal life is to know God. And to know God is to have a personal relationship with Him. Therefore, when the Holy Bible speaks of eternal life in the Kingdom of God, it is a reference to having been saved and enjoying the Holy vision of God for eternity. Those who love Jesus, they are of one spiritual mind with those who also obey the command of the Lord. United in one Faith in the Lord Jesus, we are gathered here to adore and worship our Lord, our God.

God our redeemer, you have delivered us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of your Son: grant, that as by his death he has recalled us to life, so by his continual presence in us he may raise us to eternal joy; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.
